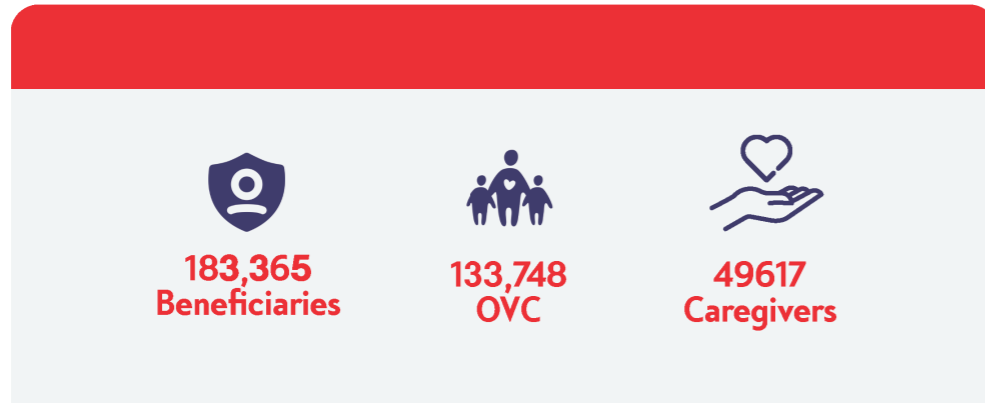


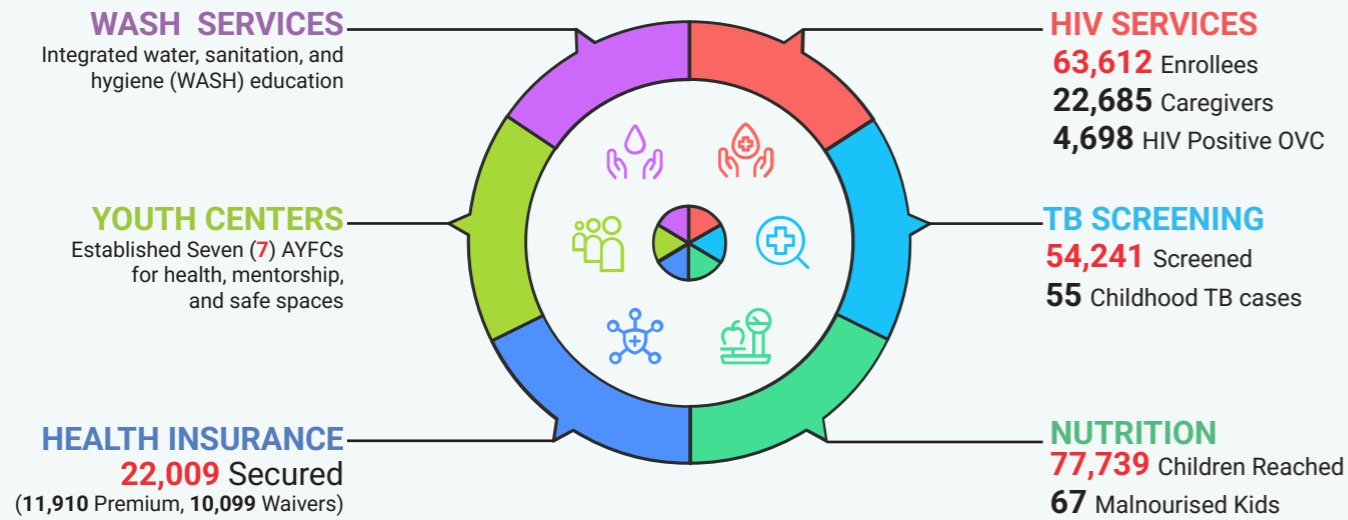
ICHSSA-2 COMPREHENSIVE FACTSHEET

A Legacy of Impact for Vulnerable Children (2019–2024)

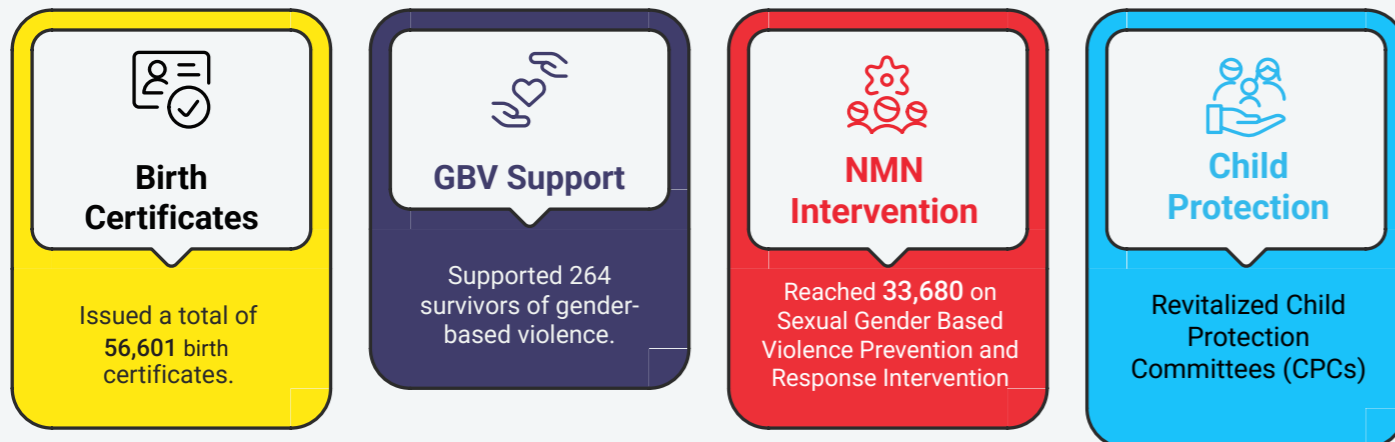
The Integrated Child Health and Social Services Award 2 (ICHSSA-2) is a USAID-funded initiative led by the Association for Reproductive and Family Health (ARFH) with Project HOPE and FHI360. The project spanned 40 Local Government Areas (LGAs) in Lagos, Edo, and Kwara States, Nigeria from 2019 to 2024. From an initial 10 CBOs in Lagos, it grew to include 3 in Edo and 2 in Kwara, serving **183,365** beneficiaries—**133,748** orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) and **49,617** caregivers with transformative support across four domains—**Healthy, Safe, Stable, Schooled**—while embedding sustainability into local systems.

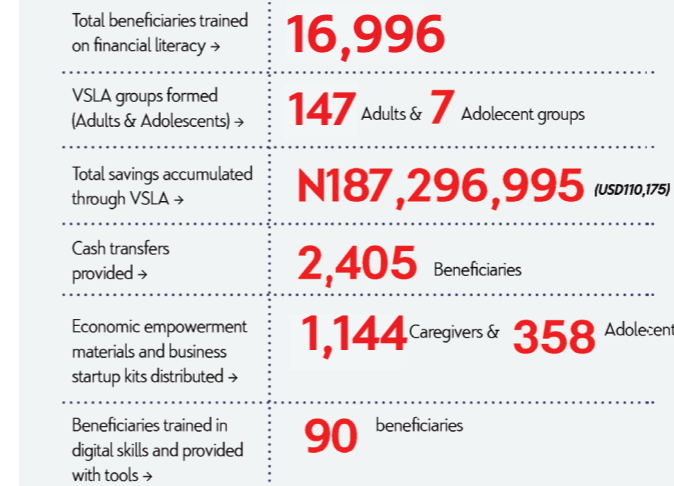

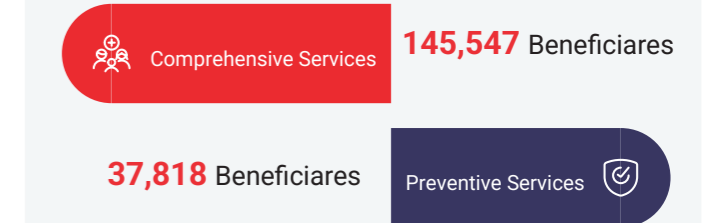

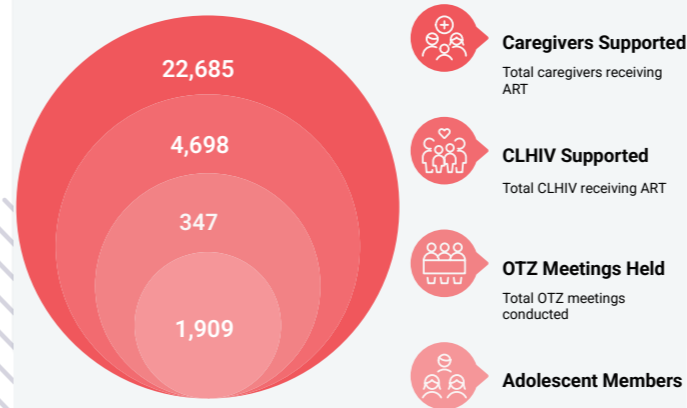
